## Parents and Citizens Meeting

All parents/carers are encouraged to come along and learn more about our school and our decision making processes and how we endeavour to improve student learning outcomes amongst other topics. #### Student Resource Scheme (SRS)

The Student Resource Scheme fees are \$260. Whilst the cost of providing instruction, administration and facilities for the education of a student at a state school is met by the State, parents are directly responsible for providing their student with other resources for the student's use whilst attending school.

#### What is a Student Resource Scheme (SRS)

A SRS is a service provided by the school to assist parents with a cost effective alternative to purchasing textbooks, resources, consumables and/or materials from elsewhere, through reduced prices gained from the school's bulk purchasing processes. These resources enhance the student's engagement with the curriculum. A SRS provides a convenient option that offers good value to participants and ensures participating students have access to the same standard of resources. Parents will need to provide these resources themselves if they choose not to participate in the SRS.

Participation in the Scheme is voluntary and no obligation is placed on a parent/caregiver to participate. A parent/caregiver who does not wish to participate in the Scheme will be responsible for providing the items included on the resource list (available from the office) so their student can engage fully with the curriculum. If you decide not to participate please return the Participation

Agreement Form to the payment office and an appointment will be made with the principal or delegate to discuss provision of resources for your student.

Participation in the Student Resource Scheme will be assumed if written notice of non-participation is not received.

School Policy, endorsed by the P&C, is that prior to any non-compulsory school activity such as excursions, competitions, performances, camps, senior jerseys or formals that all fees be paid or an approved payment arrangement entered into.

If you will be participating in the Scheme payments are due as follows:

1st instalment: \$90 payment due by 03 February 2022

2nd instalment: \$90 payment due by 28th April 2022

3rd instalment: \$80 final payment due by 21st July 2022.

If you receive Centrepay then you may be able to have weekly/fortnightly deductions taken out of your benefit for your student's fees. Contact the office to ask how on 38261333.
