

Kingston State College Student Uniform Code

The uniform code has been developed by students, teachers and parents and unanimously passed by the P&C Committee and will be strictly implemented. The complete school uniform must be worn to, from and at school. Non-compliance will be addressed as per the Student Code of Conduct. All clothing must be purchased from the uniform shop unless indicated. These items do not have brand name logos, stripes or external pockets.

- Year 7–10 students are expected to wear the polo/sports uniform. Formal uniform is optional.
- Year 11 and 12 students must wear formal uniform. Students may change in to sports uniform for sports lessons and then change back in to formal uniform for all other lessons. The Senior polo is an optional item that can only be worn on Tuesday to Friday.

Noncompliance with Dress Code

Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 Section 362 of the Act (1) If a student of a State school does not comply with a dress code for the school's students, developed under section 360, the school's principal may only impose one of the following sanctions;

- (a) detention of the student for a period mentioned in section 283(3);
- (b) prevent the student from attending, or participating in, any activity for which the student would have been representing the school;
- (c) prevent the student from attending, or participating in, any school activity that, in the reasonable opinion of the school's principal, is not part of the essential educational program of the school.

Non-Compliance Procedure

Uniform pool will be maintained at the student services building and staffed by the Student Support Officer from 8:30 to 9:15 and 2:30 to 3:00.

Students arriving out of uniform will be referred to Student Services by 9:00 am.

Student non-uniform item bagged and tagged

- Slip given
- Student returns end of school day
- Returns uniform item
- Regains their item
- Items laundered daily

Student Responsibility

- Report to Student Services before 8:30 provide parent note to receive an approved uniform variation school note
- Return to uniform pool at 2:40
- Uniform change may be required for students completely out of uniform

Lesson 1 teachers

- Check dress code shoes shirt and shorts are the term 1 target
- Refer students to the Student Services
- If a student refuses to follow instruction, document and follow up with that student one-on-one.
- Never get into an argument with a student in front of their peers.
- If you still have no success after explaining the reasoning behind the policies, then refer to SS HOD

Student Support Officer

- Record student referred for uniform on ID Attend
- Issue uniform with collection slip
- Tag and bag student's item for collection
- Contact home for any non-returned items

Student Services HOD

- Follow up student refusal to go to access uniform pool
- Maintain list of approved uniform variations
- Communicate to teachers any negotiated variations
